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1 INTRODUCTION

Diabetes Mellitus is not a single disease but a syndrome consisting of different sub types of diabetes with hyperglycemia due to insulin deficiency, either absolute or relative, as a common factor. Its prevalence is increasing rapidly and has already reached an epidemic proportion in urban India. Hence every Family Physician and General Duty Medical Officer should be proficient in managing diabetic patients. If one's basics are strong, it is very easy to take correct decisions regarding ordering precise investigations, advising about diet and exercise and selecting appropriate Oral Hypoglycemic Agents (OHA) or Insulin in correct dosages.

The aim of this book is to provide concise information required for a Family Physician or General Duty Medical Officer, to let him confidently handle his diabetic patients on his own and manage them successfully over a period of time. It will also be useful to the General Physician and Residents in medicine. As clearly mentioned in the title, this handbook mainly deals with the management of Non Insulin Dependent Diabetic Patients (previously known as Maturity Onset Diabetics), in an out-patient/dispensary set-up. However, it may be noted that more than 96% of our diabetics are Non-Insulin Dependent.
